**ORBIT INTERNATIONAL'S POWER GROUP RECEIVES  
NEW ORDER VALUED IN EXCESS OF \$530,000**

**Anticipates Follow-On Orders from USAF**

Hauppauge, New York, August 12, 2010 - Orbit International Corp. (NASDAQ:ORBT), a defense and industrial electronics manufacturer, systems integrator and software solution provider, today announced that its Power Group, Behlman Electronics, Inc. ("Behlman"), has received an order valued in excess of \$530,000 for its COTS Division. This new award is for a power supply to be used on the RC-135, a U.S. Airforce (USAF) all-weather reconnaissance aircraft. Deliveries under this contract are expected to commence in the fourth quarter of 2010 and continue through the second quarter of 2011.

This is the first production order for this power supply that Behlman had initially supplied on initial development orders from its customer, a prime contractor to the USAF. Behlman expects to receive follow-on orders for these units as the USAF continues to upgrade this aircraft.

Mark Tublisky, President of Behlman commented, "Behlman's ability to modify its standard products to meet specific customer requirements has enabled us to be successful in winning these types of contracts. The receipt of these orders continues to validate Behlman's business model which emphasizes flexible designs, individualized engineering support and superior customer service. This approach has proved successful in enabling Behlman to grow its COTS Division and we remain confident that this approach will continue to lead to future business opportunities."

Dennis Sunshine, President and Chief Executive Officer of Orbit International Corp. commented, "Behlman's extensive experience in providing COTS power solutions has enabled it to expand into new markets as the U.S. military continues to strive to decrease program development costs and to bring programs to production more rapidly than could normally be achieved through custom designs. In addition to increased business activity in its COTS division, Behlman's commercial division recorded an increase in business in July which culminated in its strongest bookings month of 2010. Behlman continues to experience increased activity for its commercial products and we remain confident that Behlman is poised for a strong second half of 2010".
